SNAPSHOT EdGE-inspired Education Program Brings Hope to Indigenous Kids

Mayor Divina Velasco of San Gabriel, La Union considered it a lucky day when she was invited to the National Education Summit held in September 2013 for the official launch of USAID's Education Governance Effectiveness (EdGE) Program. Then already on her second term as local chief executive and yet she feit her efforts were still not enough to uplift the condition of her 4th class municipality whose population comprise 85% indigenous people. Twelve out of fifteen barangays are located in the mountainous upland areas and as such, access to health care and education remain the biggest challenges to progress. "We had recurring problems, not only low enrolment and completion rates but more so on the quality of education," Mayor Divine says. Workshop outputs and discussions with her peens during the EdGE summit infused new and substantial ideas that the local chief executive knew she could use for her municipality. That's when she realized that familiar and conventional ways of doing things would not achieve the exceptional education program she was aiming for. "# sent me back to the drowing board and revteit our educational program," says Mayor Divine.

On November 13, 2013, the local government of San Gabriel drafted its education reform program dubied Project HOPE (Harmonizing Organizations in Pursuit of Effective Education) whose principal author is Munkipal Health Officer Dr. Hermitigido Velance. The program includes health programs to compliment the munkipality's education quality goals. It followed the principle acquired from EdGE that leaders must work hand in hand with the community in order to nake the quality of education. "Thereforming the leader, the institution and the constituents is a foreneeserk that goes better direction and focus on the things we wanted to achieve," Mayor Davies says. The project had three specific objectness: to transform the local leadership, to establish a more responsive education institution and to empower the citizenty.

The project started with the expansion of the local school board to increase participation among community stakeholders. It then proceeded to capacitybuilding activities to prepare its members for the various projects aireed at improving attendance of children in school. An education summit held in November 2013 engaged teachers about the goals and activities under the program. Project HOPE has since sponsored regular training for teachen, computer-teracy sessions for Grade 6 students, conducted parenting workshops and remedial programs to assist low-performing pupils, mobilized youth volanteen to teach children during summer vacations, among others.

San Gabriel new has 100% participation rate as a result of community engagement. True to its declaration to empower the ditterry, Project HOPE has now widened community involvement by allowing private individuals to donate to its projects. These ditterm are currently helping about 200 indigent children to continue, their high school and college education by paying for their miscellaneous fees, school materials and privileg cash allowances.

EdGE is a 5-year program that seeks to improve education governance with the end-goal of improving learning outcomes.
